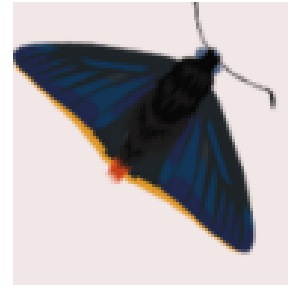


Firetips' Curriculum letter (Nursery)- Spring term 2026



Welcome back! We hope you have had a lovely break. We have already heard many amazing stories about what the children got up to during the holidays. Please do share photos and these special moments on Tapestry with us.

This half term our topic is, '**Once upon a time.**' This topic pays attention to traditional tales, kick starting with, 'Goldilocks and the three bears.' Below is a breakdown of how we will be learning within the 7 areas of the EYFS outcomes.

In **Literacy**, we will be sequencing stories, using descriptive language, developing our comprehension, exploring rhyme and many other independent writing activities. Phonics will see some of us embedding our phase 1 phonic skills, whilst some of us continue with exploring phase 2 sounds.

In **Maths**, we will be using numicon to explore and sequence number. We will begin to develop our understanding on further 2D shapes, use language related to size and pay particular attention to the deeper understanding of numbers 1-5. As always, we will share how to explore these areas at home via Tapestry.

Expressive Art and Design will happen as the children engage and enjoy our role-play this term, which is a fairy-tale forest camp. Children will paint characters from the stories and use a variety of materials to make masks. In music, they will explore how sounds can be changed and celebrating the Chinese new year through music and dance.

In our **Physical Development** sessions, we will be looking at ball skills through Football and Tennis before moving onto Gymnastics.

Personal, Social and Emotional development, will continue through our everyday routines, adapting our behaviours to different situations in school, sharing, taking turns and empathising with others in our general day to day activities that take place in early years. Our 'Feel good Friday' sessions will continue to use JIGSAW, to explore a sequence of lessons about 'Dreams and goals.'

Show and tell will continue to enhance our **Communication & Language** skills, along with using our voice to act out different characters, continuing with our oracy skills, listening to others and using talk to organise, sequence and clarify thinking, ideas, feelings and events.

For **Understanding of the world**, we will be exploring how different people celebrate and exploring Hinduism. We will be heading to forest school and in our Science lessons, we will continue exploring materials before moving onto Minibeast and growing.

We will be using the outdoors to assist our learning in all area, as well as our visits to forest school.

Tapestry

Now the weather has changed please provide a coat in school at all times for when we head outdoors and wellies for when we are splashing in puddles and digging for mud for our mud cakes. Music

Music lessons will take place every Wednesday with Mr Mitchell.

Reading:

It is expected that your child should be reading at home for at least 10 minutes a day and this should be recorded in their reading record. Reading records will be checked daily so please make sure they are signed and in school daily. A reminder that only one read per day will be counted towards our 'Give me ten' scheme. If they read more than once or are read to at bed time that is fantastic, but only one read by your child will be counted. If there is anything you wish to discuss or if you have any concerns, we will be happy to talk to you at a convenient time. We want all the children to get their golden token for the vending machine this term, please keep reading.
