Knowing and understanding religions and world views	<p>Pupils will be able to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Describe ways in which Christianity seems to be a strong religion today• Describe what Christians might learn about the after-life from Bible stories• Describe some of the ways in which people can show fairness in today's society• Discuss the importance of Christmas and Easter celebrations and traditions in relation to Jesus• Explore different celebrations and traditions for all religions.• Explore how other religions show commitment through religious practices• Describe how people of other faiths might try to lead lives respectful to their God• Develop understanding of the beliefs of Humanism and the impact it has on daily life
